Line Flushing

The Town Foreman intends to flush the water and sewer lines commencing July 6, 2009. The process will cause infrequent shut offs, higher than usual turbidity as well as pressure issues occasionally. This process is a necessary activity for the safe operation of our utility. We apologize for any in-

convenience. The entire flushing process will be done over a two to three week period, so you may encounter these problems for a few weeks.
