## News from the Town Office

We are in the thick of snow removal season. We have noticed a number of trailers and unlicensed vehicles around Allan. Council requests that every vehicle not routinely moved be removed from the street to facilitate snow removal. The Traffic Bylaw States:

*No person shall park a vehicle on any highway at one place for any period of time exceeding 3 days.*

As well, when clearing snow, please do not put it out onto the street. This makes the streets impassable at times, and often occurs after we've already cleared the streets. Council does not want to institute a bylaw in this regard, but if the situations continue, they may have no choice.

Apparently there are issues regarding snowmobiles as well. **The Snowmobile Act** states that no person shall operate a snowmobile without a drivers' license or accompanied by a person with a drivers' license and must be over 12 years of age. It also requires that snowmobiles must be registered. Once the provincial statutes are obeyed, then, The Traffic Bylaw States:

### (g) SNOWMOBILES

1. Under the provisions of The Snowmobile Act, (and subject to section (g) (2) ), it shall be lawful to operate a snowmobile between the hours of 7:00 am. and 11:00 p.m. on any highway except Provincial Highway No. 397 within the limits of the municipality.
2. Notwithstanding section (g) (1) of this bylaw, it shall be lawful to operate a snowmobile on the portion of Provincial Highway No. 397 for the purpose of crossing the provincial highway.
3. Notwithstanding section (g) (1) it shall be lawful to travel directly between the individuals residence and town limits between 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.

## Notice of Intent – Whistle Cessation

Be it known that the Town of Allan, Saskatchewan, has passed Bylaw No. 03-2013 which prohibits the sounding of engine whistles at Canadian National Railway Crossings MP 158.50 and 159.31 and is requesting approval from Transport Canada.
